4-H Record Book/Forms

For the past several years we have had an option to complete record keeping in an online system. This format is no longer available. You can however complete your record book with word documents or google forms. All record book forms can be downloaded and saved to your computer to be completed throughout the year. Remember record books should be printed and submitted annually to your club leaders in September. YQCA-Training



Youth for the Quality Care of Animals is a required training for all youth exhibitors entering animals in a fair. (Rabbits, Poultry, Turkeys, Beef Cattle, Dairy Cattle, Meat Goats, Dairy Goats, Sheep, and Swine)

The online training is taken at home by each exhibitor at your convenience. Remember that fairs require the completion of the training prior to your entry into the fair. Training is good for one year from the date completed. Make sure you print and keep a copy of the completed certificate.

Siskiyou Golden Fair-Updates

Show Attire: 4-H members are encouraged to wear the traditional 4-H uniform. You can substitute blue or black jeans for the white jeans. The fair is requiring that at minimum all 4-H members must wear new blue or black jeans and white collared shirt (short or long sleeved). Small animal exhibitors must wear long sleeved white collared shirts. ** If you need whites we have shirts and pants available at the 4-H office.

Still Exhibits: Any exhibitor that has more than 10 items in the same department must deliver the items BEFORE 3:00pm on the receiving day or contact the fair office to schedule an appointment with the Department Supervisor. Fine Arts, Crafts and Vocational Education Projects receiving day has been moved to Sunday (the weekend before fair) from 8:00am to 6:00pm. Still exhibits will only be available for pickup on Monday after the fair from 8am to 6pm.

Livestock Drop off Times: Each species has specific drop off times. Please see the daily schedule for drop off times.

Market Animal Photos: Market entry exhibitors are asked to take photos at home of them and their animals. (One photo for each animal exhibit) You must provide the photos to the livestock office when you check in at the fair. These photos should be standard 4x6 landscape photos. These will be used on buyers cards at the auction so please wear your uniforms for the photos and have your animals clean and looking show ready. Please put your name and club on the back of the photo when you submit them.

Preg. Check for Heifers: All Marketed Beef and Dairy heifers will be preg checked on Saturday, August 7th. Two locations will be available. 3:30pm-4:30pm in Scott Valley and 5:30pmto 6:30 at the fairgrounds. Please provide your yellow slips at this time. Remember you need one that is your bill of sale from when you purchased the animal and one that is a consignment to the 10th District JLAC.

YQCA Certificates: The fair is requiring all animal exhibitors to turn in their YQCA certificates to the fair by July 23 at 5pm. You will be asked for the certificate number when you create your entries but they still would like your certificates to be submitted. You can email to michellee@sisqfair.com or mail/deliver them to the fair office.

Parent Passes: Passes must be purchased online through the entry program. Two passes per family of a junior livestock exhibitor may be purchased in advance at a discount. Passes will not be sold on-sight.

Auction Thank You Cards: Auction thank you cards must be turned into the fair office no later than September 30th or the seller will have to request their check from the Junior Livestock Auction Committee once meetings resume.
