New Year Enrollment

We are gearing up to start a new year of 4-H.

September is the beginning of the process for members to join 4-H for the upcoming 2022-2023 program year. Enrollment should be completed online at https://v2.4honline.com Please note when enrolling the best web browsers to use are Firefox and google chrome. Fees for enrollment are as follows. Youth \$62, leaders \$28. Enrollment fees can be paid to Siskiyou County 4-H by sending or delivering cash or check payments to the Cooperative Extension Office 1655 S. Main Street, Yreka, CA 96097. We also offer an online option to pay 4-H membership fees which can be found at https://cesiskiyou.ucanr.edu/ note a \$2.00 transaction fee is charged via online payment. If you area a returning 4-H member please complete the online enrollment and pay dues by October 15th to be eligible to sell a market animal at fair. If you are a new member to 4-H please complete the online enrollment and pay dues by November 15th to be eligible to sell a market animal at fair. Anyone can join 4-H any time during the year. However if it is passed these deadlines they will not be eligible to market their project animal through the fair as a 4-H member.

Record Book

Turning in a record book is not required. However, members are encouraged to complete and submit a record book to their club for review to be eligible to receive star ranks, 100% attendance, and project completion medals. At minimum members must complete the Annual Project Report forms to earn a year stripe and participation medal. In addition, members who completed the record books are eligible to enter the county Record Book Competition. All County entries must be submitted by September 15, 2022 to the 4-H office 1655 S. Main Street Yreka.
