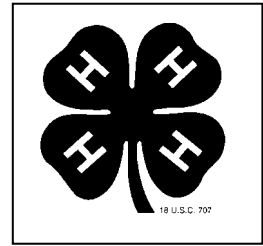

In special circumstances chaperones could be shared between counties. Please contact the Committee for assistance in advance, if you wish to share chaperones.


