Tulelake-Butte Valley Fair Update

As fair is fast approaching, I wanted to provide you with a few fyi's for this year's fair in hopes that we can all be better prepared for last minute problems that always seem to arise during fairtime!

- 1. Add-On's: The rotary will only be accepting add-ons for the animals sold thru the auction until Monday, September 13 at 12 noon. After that, no add-ons or any type of bonus money will be added to the auction checks.
- 2. Bedding: The fair will provide the first bedding of shavings for the swine/sheep barn. The fair will not provide any further wood shavings after the first bedding is supplied. The fair will provide chips for the beef barns. This year we will have two loads rather than just one load and thus there will be some extra chips left over. The spare wood chips will be stored alongside the north end of the Sr. Beef Barn. All exhibitors may use the chips for extra bedding throughout the week. However, after the extra wood chips are gone, the fair will not have any further bedding to provide the exhibitors. Please inform the exhibitors that they might want to purchase some wood shavings for their pens prior to fair in order to maintain a clean environment for their animal.
- 3. Beef Tie-Outs: Beef Exhibitors may use the side of the show ring for tying their animals to, BUT they will be responsible for cleaning up 100% of the manure, left over hay, feed pans, etc. that is in the location of their animal. The clean-up must be done prior to the shows on Friday, Saturday and Sunday's Grease pig contest. The RED TAG POLICY will be in full effect.
- 4. There will not be any food allowed in the barn areas. Please see and inform your members the attached information regarding transmission of pathogens in livestock barns.

The rules for Recycled have been re-written so that it is clear that the original materials must be a garment(s) and the finished product must be a different garment(s). Alterations such as shortening a prom dress into a shorter dress do not qualify for the recycled category.
